Pastor's Corner

Making a Spiritual Retreat with the Lord this Lent

Beloved Parishioners,

As we continue our journey into the Lenten season, I share with you my reflection on the great value of a Spiritual Retreat which is one of the programs that has been included in our Lenten schedule this year. Retreat most often takes place in a secluded environment outside of one's home to give one serene opportunity of time to reflect, meditate and make decisive decision with God's Holy Spirit on how to refocus one's life on God. Nevertheless, a parish retreat may not take that format but while the person is still within the known environment the individual tries to observe some time for deep reflection and meditation.

Retreat is generally the time to withdraw from our normal regular routine to have a deeper connection with the Lord. It is a period purposely set aside to meditate, reflect, and have a profound relationship with God. The period of retreat helps us to look inward to evaluate our stand with God and our fellow brothers and sisters. Spiritual retreat plays a significant role in deepening one's connection with God. It gives us time to break away from the distraction that dominates our everyday lives. We read in Luke 9:10, "on their return the apostles told him what they had done. And he took them and withdrew apart to a city called Bethsaida." Jesus took them away to rest from all the activities they have been doing as he wants them to look inwards and reconnect themselves with Him the Master. Again, in Luke's Gospel 5:15-16, we read, "But so much the more the report went abroad concerning him, and great multitude gathered to hear him and be healed of their infirmities. But he withdrew to the wilderness and prayed." This tells us that even Jesus from time to time withdraws to pray and reconnect himself with His Father. As Jesus has shown us the example of how to withdraw and be connected with Him let us take this retreat opportunity of our parish to pray and be connected with Jesus more deeply and this season of

Lent is a perfect example to do that.

Furthermore, "A retreat refreshes and revitalizes, gives the opportunity for more time spent in prayer and contemplation, and rekindles and deepens one's relationship with God. One may take this opportunity to hear God's call more clearly and seek God's healing grace and thereby attain a degree of spiritual renewal. The purpose of a spiritual retreat as an addition to daily spiritual activities, is to temporarily leave behind the usual distraction we face for a time long enough to allow relaxation and for inner change to occur. The ongoing conversion of heart that is critical to deepening faith." Retreat period affords us the opportunity to reflect on our journey towards heaven, our destiny, and direct our lives towards God in a world filled with so many noises. When we step away from our daily routine and busy schedule, the Father will fill us with His life and grace so that we will grow in holiness in our families. Retreat helps our souls become "rich soil" that can produce fruit "a hundred or sixty or thirty-fold" (Matthew 13:8).

Beloved parishioners, I am very optimistic that God will fill our hearts, our families and church with the Holy Spirit if we make sincere effort to set aside a couple of things this five days and offer it to God in this retreat. I am encouraging everyone to be fully involved in all the activities during these days. There would be morning and evening talks each day in addition to sessions of prayer, adoration, and confessions. I am equally praying for divine healing in many of our parishioners as we begin this five-day encounter with the Lord during this retreat. My final message to everyone is to pray intensely and ask God's divine assistance that you may see Him in your own personal life. May you be blessed as you plan to attend this retreat.

Theme: God is Always Faithful

2nd Sunday of Lent Year B, February 25, 2024

1st Reading Genesis 22:1-2, 9a, 10-13, 15-18, 2nd Reading Romans 8:31b-34, Gospel Mark 9:2-10

Today is the second Sunday of Lent, a season of grace, prayer, penance, and almsgiving that helps us walk with God. The Lenten observances and practices are meaningful if they are carried out in loving obedience and faith to God. Lent, as a season of grace, is a time we leave behind those distractions and develop a deeper relationship with God. In today's liturgy, we are called upon to have absolute faith in God irrespective of the challenges and trials that confront us every day. Such challenges can lead to loss of faith in God but from the example of Abraham in the first reading and Paul's injunction in the second we are encouraged to remain firm and steadfast.

In the first reading from the book of Genesis, Abraham our father in faith demonstrates his faith when he did not refuse God's instruction to offer his beloved son Isaac. Through the eyes of faith, Abraham recognized God and God's call in his life. He is called our father in faith because he puts all his hope in the promises of God. That's why when he was called to sacrifice his only son Isaac, whom he loves so much, he did not fret or doubt but obeyed God. At times, God allows things in our lives which we cannot understand. Although this should make us question our powers of understanding, we are instead tempted to question God's love. To dispel all doubt about His love, the Lord does not necessarily explain in detail why things are the way they are, rather He speaks to us of His cross. He does not always explain why we suffer but rather that He suffered and died for love of us.

In the same way, Paul in the second reading wants to assure the struggling Christians of Rome of the infinite love of God for them. It is often obvious that when people are besieged by trials and difficulties on

every side, it is easy to doubt if God is really for us. To reassure them that, yes, God is still with them in their suffering, Paul alludes to the story of Abraham's sacrifice of his son Isaac. He makes this allusion so that the people of God should not be surprised if they are visited with undeserved suffering because even God's only Son went through suffering and death that He did not deserve. Again, to underline the strong point of God's infinite love, He who did not withhold His own son, but gave Him up for all of us, will He not also give us everything else? Dear friends, let our faith or love for God not weaken when faced with trials and challenges of life. Christ is not a neutral observer recording and judging our actions and failures. He is on our side, supporting us with His grace, to make sure that we do not fall at all. He is very much interested and concerned with every affliction that comes our way and will never abandon us. With this new understanding of Christ who is not a disinterested judge but a committed advocate on our side, Paul concludes by asking a series of questions, which we will do well to answer for ourselves today and always. "Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will hardship, distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? No, in all these we are more than conquerors through him who loved us." (Rom 8:33-34)

In the gospel we hear the beautiful story of the transfiguration as told by Mark. We hear God call out from the cloud "this is my beloved son, listen to him". How often do we really take time off our day or even week to listen to him? Let us take time now not only to listen to God but think about what He is telling us to do with our lives and act on it.

Please stop by the Tables of Religious Wares (Nativity set, rosaries, statues, crucifixes, charms, etc.) after all the Masses the weekend of March 2 & 3, 2024. Ayman Khair is representing about 180 Christian families from

Bethlehem. These families have been dependent upon sales of their hand carved religious articles to tourists of the Holy Land. Due to the conflict in the Middle East and the Pandemic, tourism has been stopped completely from March 2, 2020, till February 2022, and now because of what is going on in the Holy Land tourism has stopped completely. It is very important to support them at this critical time, since they have no income and there is no tourism at all. In order to survive, they have turned to Christian communities in the United States to purchase their articles. These **hand carved religious articles are beyond description.** Carved from **wood of the sacred Olive tree**, this workmanship has been traditional for these families for hundreds of years. It is hoped that through the efforts of Mr. Khair, these families who have little income are able to stay alive and survive in the Holy Land. Sadly enough, the Christian population dropped from 22% to less than 2% in the last 20 years. Thank you in advance for your support.
