


## The Fifth Sunday of Easter MAY 15, 2022

## **Theme: We Are Called to love as Jesus has loved Us**

5<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Easter Year C May 15<sup>th</sup> 2022

First Reading Acts 14:21-27, Second Reading Rev. 21:1-5a, Gospel John 13:31-33a, 34-35

The first reading from the Acts of the Apostles narrates how Paul and Barnabas proclaimed the good news and made a considerable number of disciples. They made a considerable number of converts not without hardship, but with encouraging each other in the midst of challenges. We were told they returned to Lystr, to Iconium and to Antioch to strengthen the spirit of the disciples. There was a great need to encourage one another in the service of God. When we encourage one another, it brings healing and restores hope and this is what gives fruit to the work of evangelization. In the same way, when we encourage each other's spirit, we make more progress and achieve more in our relationships and families. The last point here for us to take is commending our project to God with prayer and fasting.

The central message in today's Gospel is the command of Jesus to all of us, "I give you a new commandment, Love One Another as I have loved you." To be able to understand the message we need to find out how Jesus loved us. There are five ways in which Jesus loved us and it is these five ways that He encourages us to love one another. First, Jesus loved us sacrificially, Jesus sacrificed everything for us. He gave himself up completely for the love He has for us without holding back anything. At the end He gave us even the last thing He had, His mother Mary to be our mother. In the same way, Jesus calls each one of us to learn how to sacrifice for others. We begin that from our families and those dear to us to make sacrifices for the other.

Second, Jesus loved us selflessly. There was nothing He wished to gain from loving us, yet He emptied Himself for us. So often we think of what will this love do for me, or what would I benefit from a particular relationship or friendship which means it is our happiness that we are seeking. But Jesus never thought of Himself. His one desire was to give Himself and all He had for those He loved. We are all called to love as Jesus loved us and avoid selfishness. Third, He loved us with an understanding heart. He understands us the way we are and loved us the way we are. He understands our doubt, our weaknesses, our anxieties and our failings and yet He loved us. In the same way, we are called to love one another by understanding each other the way we are. We should not love people by wanting them to be the way we are or the way we want them to be, rather let's love them as they are.

Jesus loved us patiently; He is always patient with us. He was always patient with Peter and His disciples, even when they failed to realize who He was and failed to understand who He is. He wants us to be patient with ourselves and patient with one another. Even when the apostles like Peter, Thomas and others could not understand Him, He still loved them. Paul in his letter 1 Cor 13:4-7 tells us that love is patient and kind, love is not jealous or boastful, it is not arrogant or rude. Love does not insist on its own way, it is not irritable, or resentful, it does not rejoice at wrong, but rejoices in right. Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things and endures all things.

Finally, He loved us forgivingly. He loved His disciples despite all their betrayals. Their leader was to deny Him. They all forsake Him in the hour of need. They never understood Him, and were insensitive, but Jesus held nothing against them: there was no failure which He could not forgive, the love which has not learned to forgive cannot do anything but die. Real love and true love must be built on forgiveness. If truly we love our spouses, our brothers, sisters, parents, children and friends we must learn to forgive them.

I pray in this Mass that God gives us that great heart and spirit to love one another as Jesus loved us.

GOSPEL MEDITATION -  
ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE



**May 15, 2022**  
**5th Sunday of Easter**

“It is necessary for us to undergo many hardships to enter the Kingdom of God.” Many folks really work very hard to circumvent difficult situations. We prefer the easier way around something, rather than risk inconvenience, hurt or prolonged suffering. It’s no wonder euthanasia is rapidly becoming acceptable around the world. Through purely human eyes, there is no issue bypassing the inevitable, taking control and bringing things more swiftly to a place of peace. If this is the way God sees things, then why does Jesus make such a big deal helping us understand the experience of suffering and embrace it? God’s wisdom clearly takes us in another direction.

Imagine if we were able to eradicate ALL hardship and suffering. Where would we be? As we look at our own journeys, many of our solid more growth producing life lessons have been born of suffering, disappointment, inconvenience, darkness, and despair. There is something sacred about all of these experiences as God uses them to create something new. Envisioning a life without hardship and suffering brings us to a vision where everything is flat-lined and dull. As much as hardship and suffering are difficult crosses to bear, not taking them up runs the risk of us becoming shallow, empty, and lifeless. Helen Keller remarks that, “a happy life consists not in the absence but in the mastery of hardships.” What an incredibly wise insight! Many really successful people and saints were brought to their station in life because they suffered. Suffering teaches us about what’s important and propels us to search the depths of our souls for resources and strength we never would have known before.

This is especially true when we love as Jesus asks us to love. Love, perhaps above any other experience, can cause us great hardship, pain, and suffering especially when it’s authentic and unconditional. While it can thrust us into an incredible experience of God and life on one hand, it can bruise and wound us deeply on the other. Mastering the art of love is the secret to living life well, walking in the presence of God and investing in the joy of the Gospel. Love and suffering walk hand in hand. Compromising one will compromise the other. Maybe that’s why Jesus spent so much time convincing us to accept both.


MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO –  
ALENTAR UN ENTENDIMIENTO MÁS PROFUNDO DE LA ESCRITURA  
(Gospel Meditations)

**15 de mayo de 2022**  
**5° Domingo de Pascua**



El Tiempo de la Pascua trata de hacer nuevas todas las cosas, de mirar la vida con ojos nuevos. Es decir, con la memoria siempre viva y activa en la mañana de la resurrección, con la esperanza de que Cristo está presente entre nosotros. No fue un fantasma el que resucitó, es Jesús vivo que pide que lo toquemos como él mismo pidió al apóstol santo Tomás. El sufrimiento es cosa del pasado. ¿Crees esto?

En la segunda Lectura de la Liturgia de la Palabra, el libro del Apocalipsis nos lo presenta así: “*Esta es la morada de Dios entre los hombres; el habitará en medio de ellos; ellos serán su pueblo y él será su Dios – con ellos; él enjugará las lágrimas de sus ojos. Ya no habrá muerte ni lamento, ni llanto ni pena, pues todo lo anterior ha pasado*” (Apocalipsis 21:3-4). Pero, para que el sufrimiento pase, necesitamos el amor, la compasión, la empatía de los unos para con los otros. Nada se hace por magia, se debe de poner la entrega, el compromiso a la persona. “*Les doy un mandamiento nuevo: que se amen los unos a los otros. Ustedes deben amarse unos a otros como yo los he amado*” (Juan 13:34-35). El Papa Francisco nos dice que “*El amor es el único documento válido para ser reconocidos como discípulos de Jesús*”. Ahora bien, al ya saber todo esto, ¿cuál será nuestra respuesta? ¿Nos quedaremos impávidos sin hacer nada ante el sufrimiento y la injusticia? O, por el contrario, ¿lucharemos contra viento y marea por hacer el bien? ¡De ti depende todo!
