# Pastor's Corner

**First Friday All Day Eucharistic Adoration for Our Parish beginning in October.**

According to St. John Paul II the worship of "the Eucharist outside of Mass is of 'inestimable value' to the Church." In Eucharistic Adoration outside the Mass the Adorer recognizes the unique presence of God in the Blessed Eucharist. It demonstrates the faith of the individual in the presence of God exposed. Countless testimonies have been recorded about the power of the Eucharistic Adoration. According to Sr. Faustina "Eucharistic Adoration is the perfect way to both receive the grace of God's mercy, and to become merciful so that you can give it to others."

Spending time before the Lord in Eucharistic Adoration changes life, transforms the individual, & ushers in a peace that comes from inside. John Paul II says, "Jesus awaits for us in the Eucharistic Adoration in the sacrament of Love. Just as you can't be exposed to the sun without receiving it's rays, neither can you come to Jesus exposed in the Blessed Sacrament without receiving the divine rays of His grace, His love, His peace." "Christ is truly the Emmanuel, that is, God with us, day and night, He is in our midst. He dwells with us full of grace and truth. He restores morality, nourishes virtue, consoles the afflicted, strengthens the weak."

On my personal testimony, I have found spending time with the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament is the most beneficial time for me every day. I try to begin my day with our Lord in the Eucharistic Adoration, then go for my walk, then the day begins, and I have found strength, comfort, and peace amidst the challenges of the day's task after each time I stayed with the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. Most of my decisions, insights, my homilies and plans for the parish are presented to the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. When I am confused and do not know what to do, I present it to the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. There is nothing to compare with it. I am happy to share with you that our school kids practice Eucharistic Adoration every day.

My beloved parishioners, it is on this note that I wish to propose we all, as a parish, begin all day Eucharist Adoration Every First Friday of the Month and see how it goes. This would require that on such a day people would sign up to be with the Lord and then in the evening of that same day there would be another Mass of the Healing. I propose it to see how we as a community can explore the richness of this devotion for our parish, our families, school, and our city. I am hoping to begin this devotion on the First Friday of the month of October.

## Theme: God's Wisdom and the Cross of Jesus

23<sup>rd</sup> Sunday Ordinary Time C September 4, 2022

First Reading Wis 9:13-18b, Second Reading Philemon 9-10, 12-17. Gospel Lk 14:25-33

Today's first reading from the book of Wisdom explains that the things of the earth, which are within our own grasp, are difficult for us humans to comprehend. How then can we grasp the heavenly realities? Solomon in his numerous quests for answers on existential realities posed one fundamental question, who could know divine counsel? At the end it was clear that it is only those to whom God has given wisdom through the Holy Spirit sent from on high will know God's counsel. "A major contribution of the Book of Wisdom is the theology of the Holy Spirit. The book characterizes divine wisdom as a person and virtually identifies her as the Spirit of God, that is the Holy Spirit." The Holy Spirit guides us to understand the things within us and beyond and when we open our hearts to the power of the Holy Spirit we are sure to receive enlightenment which guides us to the truth of God. Let us then dispose ourselves to the power of the Holy Spirit that God may reveal Himself more to us.

In the Gospel Jesus teaches that His would be followers must be those who prefer Him to anyone even father, mother, family or children. The second requirement is that one should carry one's cross and come after Him. The cross was an instrument of execution and torture and to carry one's cross means that you are on death row. That is to say, only those who prefer Jesus above all other things will be prepared to endure the suffering that discipleship demands. To carry one's cross means to accept whatever comes to one during his daily life as a Christian. It means to offer every form of adversity, suffering and discomfort that comes to us as Christians unto God. It is not that easy, but with the grace of God we hope to succeed. This demands that God becomes the priority of our life. When God becomes our overall priority in life, then we can sacrifice anything for His sake. Is God your priority? What is it that stands between you and the love you have for God?



## What are the special clothes a priest wears?



At Mass, the celebrant wears liturgical vestments. His

vestments include a Chasuble, which is an outer garment worn at Mass. He also wears a Stole, which is a long and thin liturgical vestment worn around the neck.

These garments are colored to match the liturgical color of the season or feast of the Church. The altar cloth often matches the liturgical color of the priest's vestments.

The colors are usually as follows: Green in Ordinary time, white for Easter/Christmas seasons, purple for Lent and Advent, and red for Pentecost, Palm Sunday, Good Friday, and on the feast of the Apostles and martyrs.



GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

September 4, 2022 - 23<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

What virtue is the cornerstone of discipleship? Love. Jesus preached about it, lived it, and summarized his greatest commandment featuring it. Love is in our DNA. To follow Jesus, then, is to follow the path of love. While this may appear to be an attractive and easy option, it most assuredly is not. Authentic love always comes with sacrifice. It is the complete giving of oneself to another. The sacrificial character of love always requires that we leave something aside and pursue something else. This is at the heart of self-denial. Love asks us to make choices that are often difficult.



There is a reason Jesus asks that the love of God come first. “Charity is the right attitude of mind which prefers nothing to the knowledge of God. If a man possesses any strong attachment to the things of this earth, he cannot possess true charity (St. Maximus the Confessor).” “If anyone comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple.” A devoted disciple must be single-minded in her quest for God. She cannot allow anyone or anything to have more power over her soul than God. When any earthly attachments become more important than Love, we can get ourselves into trouble.

The Gospel calls us to walk boldly into the darkness, confusion, and emptiness of the world clothed in the mantle of love. We are asked to walk with others on their journey, offering a supportive, healing, challenging, and faithful presence. Ours is not to judge. To walk this sacrificial journey means that I must put myself aside and focus on the needs of others. “A sacrifice to be real must cost, must hurt and must empty ourselves (St. Teresa of Calcutta).” Love helps us walk straight and focus to see things more clearly and help others to do so as well. Many folks struggle to find joy and meaning in life. People may simply need someone with the freedom to sit with them in their pain, so they don’t feel so alone. Through acts of kindness, gestures of acceptance, and words of compassion, burdens can be lightened. Believe in God’s love and seek it above all other things! ©LPi


