

Pastor's Corner

Parish Updates

Beloved Parishioners,

I wish to update you on some recent developments that have taken place in the parish and the school in the last few weeks. As it was communicated in the Bulletin announcement some weeks back, the Parish Council had their monthly meeting two weeks ago. It was well attended by almost all the members and there was a couple who were part of the meeting as observers. The focus was on how to move our parish forward in a positive direction in all areas that would make it serve the people of God. There was positive discussion on the need to make our Catholic Faith more relevant and deeply appreciated in our parish and community at large. A member of the Parish Council was asked to steer a subcommittee which would involve other members of the parish to examine what needs to be done and how it can be done to make the Catholic Faith take deep root in the lives of people, especially the young and young adults and see how to bring back those who have left the faith.

There was also another member of the council who is to chair a committee charged with the responsibility to ensure better communication across the parish community. This would involve both the parish staff and the various ministries we have in the parish. This would see that no one is left in the dark about what goes on within the parish family from all quarters. They would also work hard to make sure our parish is a welcoming community where everyone is welcome and made to feel at home.

The last one is the fund-raising subcommittee which would see how to raise money for the various projects we have in the parish. The committee would explore other avenues to fund some parish projects especially our school project and other outreach ministries we have in the parish. I appeal to everyone to be open to serve in any capacity when you are approached by any of the committee heads.

The building committee had their meeting during the week to examine the need of our parish school project as it stands today. In their meeting, it was decided that while we work to raise money to begin the construction of our main school building, we will create two extra classrooms in our existing school building to accommodate the 7th and 8th grades as the number of our school keeps growing. We are happy to announce that the cost of that remodeling will be from the Yass grant given to the school. The school has been blessed graciously from the various grants that have come in support of the school project. We pray for more grants and assistance to keep our school growing.

Finally, the new St. Joseph's Hall is almost finished, and we are going to have a grand opening when we would invite the Bishop to come and open it for us. The hope is that it will become a place of meeting and gathering for our parish family to meet and know each other better.

I thank you my beloved parishioners for your great support and we keep praying and looking forward to bring the love and mercy of God closer in our service.

Theme: Our Hope in the Resurrection Gives us Strength

32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time of the Year C. November 6, 2022.

First Reading 2 Mac 7:1-2, 9-12, Second Reading 2 Thes 2:16-3: 5, Gospel Lk 20:27-38

Our first reading of today is taken from the second book of the Maccabees and it is good to note that one of the best known passages of the books of the Maccabees is the account of the martyrdom of a mother and her seven sons. They were willing to sacrifice their own lives rather than transgress the law and commandment of God. Despite the torture, the entire family remained faithful and offered the supreme sacrifice of their love and fidelity. Their courage came from the confidence they have in God who they know is trustworthy and has promised eternal life to those who abide in Him. Their courage to withstand such torture came from the hope they have in the resurrection. The lesson is that no matter how cruel the world is, no matter how cruel the world treats us, no matter what we suffer for bearing the name of Christ and for our faith, we should always look to the future with hope and glory in the promise that lay ahead which Christ has promised to all who remained steadfast till the end. As St. Paul would say, "What no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the heart of man conceived what God has prepared for those who love him." (1 Cor 2 : 9)

Resurrection is also the subject of discussion in the gospel. Luke tells us that the Sadducees came to question Jesus on resurrection. The Sadducees were a small Jewish sect very active during the time of Jesus. They differ from the Pharisees because they are solely focused on physical reality of life right now. They were very few but wealthy people in the society. They were the aristocrats and were powerful because they were the governing class. They held the view that there was no resurrection from the dead and there were no angels or spirits. They equally did not believe in the coming Messiah because that would be a disturbance to their secure life, comfort, and place in society. They came to Jesus with a question of a woman who married seven brothers as husband, and all died without any child and the woman also later died. Thus, they asked, in the resurrection, whose wife is she? They regarded such a question as a kind of thing that made the belief in resurrection of the body ridiculous. Their aim was to entrap Him and ridicule Jesus about His teaching especially on resurrection. However, Jesus in response told them that those who attain to resurrection neither marry nor are given in marriage; they are like angels and are sons and daughters of God. He proved to them that God is God of the living and not of the dead.

"The power of the resurrection is utterly overwhelmingly transformative. To be children of the resurrection is to be ready to commit ourselves into the hand of God, accepting that our relationship with God surpasses any other human relationship no matter how intimate and loving."

During the Month of November we remember our loved ones who have gone before us. On




