Pastor's Corner

New Year's Message 2023

Beloved Parishioners,

Today, the first day in the year of our Lord 2023, I wish each of you a happy New Year thanking God to have brought us to witness another year. We cannot thank the Lord enough for the opportunity to step into another year to experience His bounteous love.

As we begin this year, I encourage everyone to have absolute trust in God's abundant mercy that is unlimited. We can make best use of this opportunity when we realize that He is always near us. It is possible there may have been some challenges in the past year, but we have to put everything behind us and move on with trust, enthusiasm and hope that the year would be better. At this point, I would recommend that whatever resentment, anger, bitterness or hurt we may have experienced last year should be put aside. If there are people, situations or relationships that have caused us pain in the last year, the beginning of this year is an opportunity to let go of such pain and move on with a clean mind and heart. There is also need to take good appraisal of oneself in the light of our relationship with God, our family members, and friends to see how we can improve in this relationship.

Beloved parishioners, I want to let you know that from the beginning of this month, the parish office will be open Monday, Wednesday & Thursday from 8am to 5pm, Tuesday from 10:30am to 5pm and Friday from 8am to 12noon. We make the adjustments based on our observations of the trend of things as it is not helpful spending extra hours on light and time when there is no one to attend to. However, if there is any need in the future to adjust, we would let you know.

I would also like to mention that beginning this January, the third Sunday of each quarter after 10:30am Mass would be a day with all the new parishioners who have come into the parish. They would have lunch together with the priests, deacons, school principal, the parish staff and one or two members of the parish council. The goal is to help every new person coming to the parish to feel very welcome and to get a good understanding of the parish workings from all those that work within the parish circle so that they can be helped with anything they might need.

Furthermore, starting from this year, there would be an annual parish report to give every parishioner which will be a summary report of what has taken place in the parish every year. The idea is to get everyone to be in the know of every aspect of the parish. The report would come out by the end of January every year. We are working to get the report of this previous year finished and presented to the parish.

I will not end this write up without reminding us of the All First Friday Adoration that has been established in the parish. As I have mentioned many times during my homilies and writings, coming before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament in Adoration is a great value that you cannot exhaust its richness. Once again, I wish everyone a happy new year filled with the grace, peace and love that come from the Lord.

Theme: Mary Kept All These Things in Her Heart

Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God Year A. New Year's Day 2023

First Reading Num 6:22-27, Second Gal 4:4-7, Gospel Lk 2:16-21

The first reading of today is a prayer of blessing given to Moses by God as the format of blessing over the people. It is very profound that such prayer comes in as our first reading today as the year begins. God's blessing is what we all need especially as we step into a new year today. As no one knows how the year will unfold for each of us, God's blessing becomes very necessary for us. Besides, it would be something of great value if we take time to reflect on the various ways we were blessed by God in the last year. Whenever we count our blessings, we realize God's merciful love upon us and it becomes real for us that God is always with us in our journey.

In that prayer of blessing in the first reading Moses says, "May the Lord bless you and keep you and may His face shine upon you and be gracious to you." We need God's protection because He is the only one who holds the key to life. We need His protection because every day we are in constant battle against the enemy. We need God's protection because only in His love are we surely secured. Furthermore, when His face shines upon us as we heard in today's reading His favors come alive and the manifestation of joy, peace and blessings abound. God's face to shine upon us is to radiate His love by walking in His path. These are the graces God wants His people to be blessed with and we claim it to be our own blessing today as this year begins.

The gospel presents us with the story of the shepherds who went in haste to see the newborn Child on hearing the news of the birth of Jesus. It is very amazing to note that the shepherds were the first people to hear about the news of the birth of such a great savior. The shepherds are one of the filthiest people because of the nature of the profession but they are the people to receive the news of the holiest person. The symbolism is that it was for this people that Jesus was born. This reveals that He came for the unclean, dirty, and filthy. The testimony of the shepherd about Jesus was kept in the silence of Mary's heart. Whenever we are confronted with overwhelming situations in our lives the value of silence is the best route to take. We pray that Our Blessed Mother continues to intercede for us as we begin this new year.

Let the New Year be a blessing for us where the face of God will shine upon us to experience His gracious love.



What Biblical Readings Are Said at Mass?

Sunday Mass includes two readings (the first excerpted from the Old Testament, except during Easter, and the second usually from a New Testament book or letter) and the Gospel, while daily Mass usually has one reading and the Gospel. A responsorial psalm is said or sung in between the readings. All these readings show the continuity of the work of salvation from the Old Testament through the writings of the apostles, highlighted by the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The responsorial psalm, with its chanting and singing of the psalms, dates back to the Jewish liturgy before the time of Christ.
