

Pastor's Corner

Updates on the Parish and School

Beloved Parishioners,

It is my pleasure to share with you some recent updates and future activities that will be taking place in the parish and school.

On January 13, 2023, the superintendent of schools in the Diocese of Phoenix, Mr. Domonic Salce paid an in person visit to the school. On his arrival the school administration, the PTO president and I welcomed him on the campus. Thereafter, he was taken round the school complex, the classrooms where he interacted with the teachers and students and saw the development for himself. He was very impressed with the new facilities in the school like our SMART LAB and our renovated playground. This was followed by a long interactive meeting session we all had on the development of the school and our plans. The visit was very fruitful in all aspects as the plans for expansion of the school into 7th and 8th grades were discussed. There was also discussion on the new school building project which we are about to embark.

Last week, January 22, 2023, we began the first hospitality program of welcoming all our new parishioners to the parish. As I have stated earlier, it is a program designed to introduce the new parishioners coming into the community to the members of parish staff and some members of the school administrative team and some of the parish and finance council members. They were told

about the various ministries that exist in the parish and those responsible for each ministry. The most amazing aspect of the event was the building of friendships among the new parishioners who felt very welcome with each other. This initial one was attended by over twenty five people and all who came were very happy for the program.

The Parish Council had their monthly meeting January 17, 2023 and the major issue discussed was the survey and the concerns that were raised in the survey. The Parish Council was very happy with very useful comments and input from many who sent in their surveys. However, it was also observed that many never returned their survey or responded to it. In any case, the concerns raised by many parishioners who returned theirs have been noted and the Parish Council, in collaboration with others, is working to address the issues raised. We agreed that something would be done to begin to fix some of the problems.

The parish will resume offering coffee and donuts this Sunday after the Masses and would appreciate if many can volunteer to assist on it. The Catholic School week begins this Sunday with many activities lined up for it. The detailed information of the event is in the bulletin. Dinner with winter parishioners comes up February 25th and we are calling on those who have not registered to do so soon.

Theme: Jesus - The Beatitude

Fourth Sunday of Ordinary Time the Year A, January 29, 2023

First Reading Zep 2:3; 3:12-13, Second Reading 1 Cor 1:26-31, Gospel Mt 5:1-12

Today’s gospel reading on the beatitudes comes from the Gospel of Matthew 5:1-12. The beatitudes appeared also in the Gospel of Luke 6:20-26. There is a slight difference between Matthew’s account and that of Luke’s. Matthew presents the sermon on the Mountain while in Luke’s it is on the plain. Another thing we may notice is that while Matthew gives us eight (8), Luke gives us four and included woes to match the corresponding beatitudes. One other thing is that Luke’s beatitudes follows immediately after the choosing of the twelve. It is based on this, that many scholars have given other titles to this Sermon on the Mount. Some refer to it as “The Compendium of Christ’s Doctrines, others call it the Manifesto of the Kingdom, or the Magna Carta of the Kingdom.

It is good to point out that the Sermon on the Mount is not one single sermon Jesus preached on one definite situation, rather it is the summary of his consistent teaching to his disciples. The Sermon on the Mount is the opening of Jesus’ heart and mind to those men and women who were his right-hand men and women in his task. It is the concentrated memory hours of heart-to-heart communion between Jesus, the master, and his disciples. That is why at the beginning it says, “when he sat down his disciples came to him and he opened his mouth and taught them”.

The beatitudes speak of that joy which seeks us through our pain, that joy which sorrows and loss of pain and grief, are powerless to touch, that joy which shines through tears, and which nothing in life or death can take away. In Jn 16:22, “No one says Jesus can take away your joy from you”. A change in fortune, a collapse in health, the failure of plan, and the disappointment can take away the fickle joy the world can give. But the Christian has the serene and untouchable joy which comes from walking forever in the company of Jesus Christ.

It is also necessary to point out that the Sermon on the Mount or the Beatitudes is what some atheists have used against Christians by saying that religion is the opium of the people. Some have used it against Christians as saying that it is doctrine of the weak because Christ is a weakling. At the same time it is this same text that attracted Gandhi and he reproached Christians for the neglect of it. Ultimately, the beatitudes are nothing but a portrait of Christ’s own life. Jesus challenges his followers to live by God’s standard, they are truly in a fortunate state in life, no matter what their circumstances may be, for they bring a glimmer of joy and hope of the heavenly kingdom into the afflictions of the present world.

Hand Carved in Bethlehem

and Sunday, February 19th
Before and after all Masses

Many religious wares (Nativity sets, rosaries, statues, crucifixes, charms, etc) will be available for purchase.

Ayman Khair is representing about 180 Christian families from Bethlehem. These families have been dependent upon sales of their hand carved religious articles to tourists of the Holy Land. Due to the conflict in the Middle East and the Pandemic, tourism has been stopped completely from March 2 2020 and it is very slow now.

It is very important to support them at this critical time, since they have no income and there is no government to take care of them and help them. In order to survive, they have turned to Christian communities in the United States to purchase their articles.

These **hand carved religious articles are beyond description.** Carved from **wood of the sacred Olive tree**, this workmanship has been traditional for these families for hundreds of years. It is hoped that through the efforts of Mr. Khair, these families who have little income are able to stay alive and survive in the Holy Land. Sadly enough, the Christian population dropped from 22% to less than 2% in the last 20 years. Thank you in advance for your support.


Youth Ministry Invites You
