



Pastor's Corner

Journey of Faith Demands a Movement

Beloved Parishioners,

In todays Pastor's Corner, I share with you some of the personal reflections taken from the weekday readings of the past weeks. For the past three weeks, the first reading of the Mass came from the book of Genesis. We also saw notable people and pillars of our faith whose testimony of faith was characterized by some form of movement to an unknown destination. The readiness to move into an unknown destination trusting only in God's providence forms the core of my reflection.

The first person in this movement to an unknown destination was Abraham. He was called by God, to leave his kinsman, his familiar environment and go to an unknown place that will be shown to him. Abraham did not know anything about the place he was to go or the people or the climate. The only thing he knows is that God is a faithful God who does not disappoint His own people. The movement was tough and challenging at the early stages but, at the end, God demonstrated to Abraham that He is a faithful God.

Isaac was another man of faith who left his place to go to another country. The author of Genesis says that as Abraham gets old and was about to die he made his senior servant swear an oath he will not take a wife for his son Isaac from the Canaanites women, among whom he lived, but he should go to his kindred to take a wife for Isaac. Providentially, Isaac himself went to live in Negeb and it was there that he took a wife for himself, Rebekah. There was a movement in Isaac's life leaving behind his childhood environment to a different location. The movement was also blessed by God as Isaac found favor with God in many fronts.

Jacob made a long journey departing from Beer-sheba towards Haran and along the way he fell

asleep and found that God was there and that he must build a shrine for the Lord. He even said, "If God remains with me, to protect me on this journey I am making and gives me enough bread to eat and clothing to wear, I will set up a memorial stone to be God's abode." In his old age, he has to make the greatest movement of his life with his family down to Egypt to be with Joseph, his son, and he remained there till he passed away. There is something common to all these men; there was a movement from one point to another in their search to carry out the will of God in their lives. None knew exactly what awaits them but only trusted God's faithfulness.

Beloved people of God, for us to fulfill or reach that point God has destined for us in our relationship with Him, sometimes we need to make some movement that requires only faith not counting the cost or knowing what awaits us on the other side. Just like Abraham, Isaac and Jacob who all left their secure comfort environment to an unknown destination leaving behind their familiar terrain, we must equally be ready to do that in our This movement may take spiritual journey. different forms. It may involve moving away from some attachment to a relationship that would be hard to part with but blocks the grace of God flowing into your lives. It may be a moving in a positive direction to reconcile with your family members as Jacob did. It may be moving away from a hostile environment that distracts your peace of mind. It may be in the form of moving deeper into a spiritual relationship with God where God becomes the highest priority in your life. It may be a movement to leave behind a habitual habit that destroys ones peace of mind or health. Whatever form it may take, there is need for movement towards God in our journey of faith. We are accepting Registrations for 2023-2024 Religious Education/


Sacramental Preparation for children and teens grades K through 12. Religious Education is for children grades K-5. Sacrament Preparation is a 2-year program for children and Teens ages 7-17. The first year of preparation is for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The second year of preparation is for the Sacraments of Holy Eucharist and Confirmation. Please be sure to bring with you a copy of your child's Birth Certificate as well as their Baptismal Certificate if you are new to the program.

Registration opens on Monday, July 17th & goes through Friday, August 18th. Registration forms will be available in the Information Booth in the church or the Parish Office. The fee is \$100 per family.

The formation and faith of our children is vital to living a sacramental life, being a light, being hope in a world that has many challenges. Catechists will walk with your children on a weekly basis and share the faith and love of Christ.

Why does the priest break the Host on the altar after the Lamb of God Prayer?

Jesus celebrated the Last Supper with four great Eucharistic actions: He took, blessed, broke, and distributed the Bread (Matthew 27:45). The breaking of the Bread signifies that in communion we who are many are made one body in "the Bread of Life," Who is Christ (see John 6:48, 1Corinthians 10:17). The Mass is the Sacred Meal where we share table fellowship with Christ in His Family of love and unity. After the breaking of the Bread, the priest commingles a small part of the Host in the chalice to signify that Christ's Body and Blood are reunited in His glorious Resurrection, in Heaven, and in the Eucharist.

Our Lady of the Lake has received many blessings over the years. Since the early 2000's, we have had several priests serving at Our Lady of the Lake. When Fr. Michael Deptula was pastor, we had Fr. Fidelis Igwenwanne, Fr. Michael Ashibuogwu and Fr. Sylvester Modebei assigned to Our Lady of the Lake at different times by the Diocese of Phoenix. Our parish supported the Diocese of Issele-Uku with monetary donations 2006 through April 2019. During this time we also hosted Most Reverend Dr. Michael Elue - Bishop of Issele-Uku and presented him with many liturgical gifts including monetary donations.

The loving support of our parishioners continued when the Diocese of Zaria graciously shared their priests, Fr. Thomas Kawai, Fr. Victor Yakubu, Fr. Lawrence Bakut, Fr. Barnabas Duniya and Bishop Julius Kundi.

An appeal is being made to have Our Lady of the Lake share their generosity and support with the Congregation of the Holy Spirit. This is the order that graciously gave permission to Fr. Anthony Okolo to come to the Diocese of Phoenix and then as the Parochial Administrator of Our Lady of the Lake.

Father Tony is a member of the Congregation of

the Holy Spirit which typically works with the poor and marginalized and also works in those places where the church finds it difficult to find workers. The Province of Nigeria, South East has more than 450 members, half of which are scattered over 45 countries of the world working according to the spirit of their founders Father Claude Desplaces and Francis Libermann. The main charism of the Province is preaching the gospel message to difficult areas, working in schools, and working among young people. Facing the many challenges of taking care of the retired and elderly priests, who have come back from missions very sick and fragile and unable to care of themselves because of the lack of a proper health care system, has become a burden financially to the Province. There is also a serious need for the younger generation to have the opportunity to obtain scholarships to help access quality education.

In an effort to share our blessings with a special thank you to the Congregation of the Holy Spirit, Our Lady of the Lake will be holding an annual collection for them each year on Divine Mercy Sunday. In the meantime, should you wish to make a donation, envelopes have been placed in the pews and narthex. Donations may also be made using online giving.
