

Updates and Coming Events

Beloved Parishioners,

As we keep thanking God for his marvelous deeds in our life and parish family, I wish to share with you some recent updates and some of the events coming up soon. I would appreciate you to save the dates.

On Saturday, September 30th, the parish witnessed a historic event of the installation and establishment of the Junior Catholic Daughters of the Americas. It was the first of its kind as it is the first time the junior part of the Catholic Daughters was installed in our parish. The ceremony was awesome as young girls from the third grade to high school signed up to be members of this group. The state regent was here to perform the installation. We had about thirty-five girls who voluntarily signed up for the program. Another significant aspect of the ceremony is that they have their own officers who took an oath of loyalty before the congregation gathered to abide by the rules and move the group forward. Another amazing aspect of the installation is that we had about four girls from three families who are not Catholics but were drawn by the virtues of what they heard about the Junior Catholic Daughters and on their own decision they signed up to be members and their parents gave the full support and were there to celebrate the Mass with us. I have to say that our school has been a catalyst of evangelization in many different fronts.

Another event that took place was the parish picnic on Sunday, October 1st. It was awesome to see a good number of our parishioners who came out to socialize with others. There were families, school kids, young adults and the elderly who trooped to the venue to get together with others. I had expected to see much more than we had, but thanks to all those who came and shared life and time together. My gratitude goes to all those who worked hard to get the place ready for everyone. Our hope is to do it again next year whereby

we come together as one family in a social environment and share together.

The parish wants to appreciate all our volunteers who commit their time, talent, and energy to move our parish forward. Thus, the volunteer appreciation dinner comes up November 4th starting with the 4pm Mass. All volunteers are welcome at the Mass and during the Mass there would be a special blessing for all volunteers and special recognition of those who have retired or cannot do much again because of age or sickness. We call on all our volunteers to please save the date and be present as your presence means a lot to us here in the parish. I wish to say that a special letter of invitation has been sent to all those retired volunteers we would like to especially appreciate. I am appealing to all those who have received the letter to please call the office to let us know if you would make it. The parish would be ready to assist all those who got the letter to Mass if they do not have the means to make it to mass. Our hope is to pray with you and appreciate you before the Lord and the people of God for all your years of sacrifices to the parish. After mass, volunteers would be expected to join in the volunteer appreciation dinner.

As I said in a previous pastor's corner, Elaine Guitar who has served this parish for more than twenty -seven years retired on September 2nd. Theme: God Invites Us to a Joyous Banquet

28th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A, October 15, 2023 1st Reading Isaiah 25:6-10, 2nd Reading Philippians 4:12-14, Gospel Matthew 22:1-14, or 22:1-10

The story of a marriage feast was not something new. It was also frequently used in the Old after Sunday because of business or work, visiting Testament. A splendid feast or banquet is a good symbol of joy and happiness, as well as mutual union and love. Even in our own experience we can recall a special dinner at Thanksgiving or Christmas at which everyone enjoys not only the fine food and drink but also the conversation and the feeling of friendship and love. As Jesus told the parable in today's gospel, the king made elaborate preparations for the dinner and then sent out invitations. To the amazement of the king, some ignored the invitation and went off to attend to business and personal affairs. To the absolute indignation of the king, others rose in rebellion against him and murdered his servants.

Jesus told the parable as a warning to the people of His time and as an indication to us that we too have received an invitation for we are the people who were later called to the banquet. Thus, the parable reminds us that the invitation of God is to a feast as joyous as a wedding feast. Those of us at Mass have not ignored this invitation, or we would not be in this church today. But many in our parish community ignore the invitation to the feast of the Mass Sunday after Sunday. One outstanding thing we get from the parable is that the people who are deaf to the invitation of Jesus most often are not necessarily bad in themselves. One person went to his estate, the other to his business. They did not go off on a wild carousal. They went off to an excellent task of efficiently administering their business. In the same

way, many find it difficult to attend Mass on Sunday family members. Jesus is telling us in today's reading to make more effort in coming to the feast of the Mass He prepares for us every Sunday as He wants to dine with us at the Mass.

However, it is good to mention that the finest expression of our faith in Heaven can be made right here in the Mass. In the Mass, God our father calls us together in His home, the church. Here Christ speaks to us, and He does so in the readings, gospels, and the sermons. He also wants us to speak to Him and we do so through the prayers of the Mass. We even bring some of the goods that are used in the dinner, such as the procession with bread and wine to the altar. The climax to our celebration God calls us to His banquet table is when all share in the spiritual food of holy communion. Heaven is God's eternal home, where He wants to have a great big family celebration, and everlasting banquet of joy and happiness. We have been invited. Do not make the mistake of refusing His invitation.

The end the parable tells us that most often it is very easy for people to become so busy with the things of this world that they forget the things of eternity or to be so preoccupied with things of their own affairs giving less attention to the things of God. May we never lose sight to hear the soft invitation of the voice of Jesus to this invitation to dine with Jesus in the Mass.
